

Food & Supply Pantry

Our Food & Supply Pantry continued to operate four days per week in 2022 and served around 700 households weekly. We have maintained the operation of our pantry through the support of our dedicated volunteers, many of whom are community members who we met when they lined up to receive food for themselves and their families. As pandemic-related SNAP benefits begin to expire for our under-resourced community members in 2023, continued contributions from loyal supporters like you are more important now than ever before.

Out-of-School Time Program



2022 marked the return to full time in-person programming for our Out-of-School Time (OST) Program. Coming out of the pandemic, we've placed a great deal of focus on connection, belonging, and the social-emotional well being of the children we serve. A child enrolled in our OST Program year-round spends more hours each year at CCC than they do in school. We take this responsibility very seriously and have adapted to meet our students' needs as they arise. This has included a partnership with Harvard's PEAR Institute, which has allowed us to implement biannual social-emotional progress reports and provide individualized care for our students.

Family Nights are designed to provide space and time for families to connect with each other as well as CCC staff. At the end of the day, relationships are the foundation of our work and Family Night is where we build those relationships.

The Mental Health ACCESS Program

In the summer of 2022 a total of eight ACCESS
Youth Advocates built community through mental and physical health workshops, networked with college students and professionals in the mental health field, and explored their own identities through mentorship and community engagement. Throughout the summer, students were exposed to academic paths in mental health fields, applied their knowledge with STEAM projects, engaged in various physical activities and promoted harm reduction through community advocacy. During the fall of 2022, we partnered with the Cambridge Public Health Department to provide two community-based vaccine clinics. In total, we were able to distribute 197 COVID vaccines and 242 flu vaccines.

A HOME FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS IN CAMBRIDGE

One of our goals in 2022 was to expand our capacity to host arts and music events. Even before COVID-19 hit, rising rents had forced many of Greater Boston's most iconic music venues, practice spaces, and art studios to permanently close their doors. The post-pandemic rush to reopen larger, for-profit spaces has led to skyrocketing prices for consumers and a lack of opportunities for local artists to showcase their work. In response, our goal has been to make every room in our building available and easily accessible to the local creative community.
